



**ADDENDUM NO. 1
TO THE REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS FOR
Humboldt County SB 1383 & Organics Regional Compliance Services**

The Request for Proposals (RFP) documents shall be revised by additions to, deletion from and changes as stated in this addendum; insofar as original documents are in variance with this Addendum, this Addendum shall govern. Please note the following changes are hereby incorporated, with requested documents attached and available by link.

Responses to Written Questions:

Q1. Due to COVID-19 and not being in the office full-time, would HWMA consider waiving its request for hard copies and allow for electronic submissions only?

Yes. Electronic copies are required by the time of submission. Hard copies may follow within three (3) days of the proposal due date.

Q2. Will all documents prepared by the selected proposer follow the proposal formatting instructions, found on page 15? In other words, will all prepared documents also need to use a 12 point font and adhere to 1 inch margins?

The guidelines for the documents should generally be adhered to, however deviations will be acceptable to accommodate graphics, figures, images or tables.

Q3. Based on the outlined order of the proposal sections, found on pages 13-15, can the cover letter be reordered to appear at the beginning of the proposal?

Q4. In the interest of saving paper, can we submit a link to digital work samples instead of including them as an attachment to the proposal? Similar projects for JPAs that include individual action plans for each member agency have exceeded 200 pages.

Q7. Is there an anticipated budget or approved budget line item for this work?

No budget has been established for this project. The final budget will be negotiated once a Scope of Work is finalized.

Q8. Please provide a copy of the 2014 EAR, including the disposal tonnage amounts reported to CalRecycle, and whether they were broken out by member agency or reported in aggregate.

Q9. Generally speaking, is HWMA seeking for proposers to provide only findings, recommendations and planning services relating to SB 1383 and organics regional compliance for the member agencies? Or, is HWMA seeking those services AND support in implementing those plans, findings and recommendations?

Both. HWMA is seeking proposers that can initially provide planning services for compliance and organics recycling as specified in the RFP. After the initial planning work is complete, HWMA will be seeking assistance with implementation. Tasks may be included in the proposal for implementation but should be separated from the planning tasks so that proposals can be compared to each other.

Q 10. Has the HWMA identified a preliminary list of Tier 1 and 2 edible food generators within the project's jurisdiction or know have a sense of an approximate number of edible food generators subject to enforcement under SB 1383? This number/list is particularly important when scaling our project budget.

No. There is limited Tier 1 information available for the cities of Arcata and Eureka. Please refer to Attachment 1.

Q11. Under Task 2.b and 3.iii.2, the RFP says “Develop an organics recycling education program” and “Develop an annual education program for generators” respectively. When the HWMA says “program” are they looking for the contractor to provide education plans, to provide direct engagement services to target generators or both education plans and direct engagement services? If plans, what priority elements would the county expect to be included in the selected contractor's deliverables?

HWMA is looking for the consultant to develop the annual education program including how the outreach would be completed. HWMA does not want the consultant to include outreach in their scope of work included with this proposal. It may be included as an optional task.

Q12. Under task 3.ai.3, what does HWMA mean by, “Consider contracted services for compliance monitoring.”

HWMA will be seeking guidance on the most efficient and cost effective compliance monitoring options. Compliance monitoring may be able to be accomplished by jurisdictions themselves, or by contracting a third party. The selected consultant will need to identify what compliance monitoring is required, and recommendations for how to implement such monitoring activities.

The City's mandatory curbside collection program for residential, multifamily, commercial, and industrial businesses includes a variety of solid waste services along with curbside collection of traditional recyclables. The residential program service levels include bi monthly, monthly and weekly pick up of 20, 30, and 60 gallon solid waste services for single family residences. The variable service level provides an incentive for customers to divert more waste through waste prevention, backyard composting, green waste drop off and recycling. The City, in collaboration with Arcata Garbage Company has an effective multi-media outreach system in place for the recycling programs. In 2014 the City collected 2366.2 tons of recyclables which were diverted through the HWMA's contract with Solid Waste of Willits.

 The City's universal curbside service has reduced the need for residential drop off. However, individuals may still use HWMA, Eel River Disposal's Arcata Resource Recovery Center or Humboldt Sanitation to drop off CRV and non CRV materials. Since some Arcata residents and businesses self hauled their waste to HWMA in 2014, it is safe to assume that recyclable tonnage generated in Arcata was also recycled at HWMA. HWMA processed 497.88 tons of CRV, and 2349.9 tons of non-CRV materials in 2014 as well as 518.9 tons of OCC, 111.1 tons of rigid plastic and 170.9 tons of scrap metal. total tonnage recovered is 3648.6 tons Since there are a number of self haulers from Arcata who use this facility, the City estimates that at least 11% of the tonnage of recyclables could have originated from Arcata - this amounts to 401 tons. Arcata drop off tonnage activity at ERD and Hum San are not provided to the City.

The City works closely with AG to bring noncompliant businesses and multifamily establishments into compliance as needed. In 2013/14 the City sent two non-compliance letters to area businesses/multifamily establishment. Two additional letters were sent in the beginning of 2014/15. 3. Humboldt State University (HSU) recycled 549 tons of traditional recyclables in 2014 which is reported here. Phone books are recycled as part of the curbside pick up program. Xmas trees are accepted at the brush drop as part of that ongoing program. While both of these items are seasonal, the ability to divert through an ongoing program promotes diversion of these items. Data for 2014 tonnage is included in other tonnage figures. Seasonal diversion is also encouraged for HSU student move out times during December and May by working with HSU and apartment managers to distribute of the Tenant Move Out Diversion Guide. In 2014 HSU reports diverting surplus materials which included tonnage collected during the move out period that they refer to as the "Donation Dash". The Eureka Zoo's Education Department provided outreach and education to 1628 people during CY2014. Of that total, 927 were students directly from within Eureka. The Zoo's education program is very popular - 22 individual schools made 27 field trips to give at least 1,128 children the opportunity to participate.

The program is offered to Pre-school through 8th grade students. The lower grades are by far the largest participant groups of the program. 39% were from kindergarten and first grade, with another 12% each from pre-school and 2nd/3rd graders. The education itself is based on short presentations that correlate to the California State Science Standards. They use 10 different methods to tie behaviors to watershed conservation. For example, some methods are focused on not littering, picking up trash or composting.

An additional 500 people, adults included, attended the Zoo's Earth Day celebration where other conservation based outreach was presented at stations located throughout the zoo to educate visitors about issues like recycling, watershed pollution prevention, the impact of non-native plants, sustainable fisheries, and more.

HWMA continued to accept carpet at Hawthorne St. at the diversion rate of \$90/ton as an incentive for participation in Carpet America Recovery Effort's (CARE's) EPR pilot carpet collection and recycling program. Participants diverted 90.66 tons in 2014. This tonnage was already recorded under business waste reduction so it is not included in the "Report Year Diversion" figure for this section.

Households receive an economic incentive to dispose of hazardous waste properly by being charged only \$5.00 at the time of drop off for the first 15 gallons of material, which usually costs about \$5.00 for every gallon or \$75.00. Certified Oil Collection Centers pay the public 40¢ per gallon to properly recycle used motor oil and also accept antifreeze and used oil filters free of charge.

Waste reduction information is given on the Waste Reduction Hotline on a daily basis. Food for People collected 211.41 tons of food from local stores and an additional 35.28 tons directly from other sources in unincorporated areas of Humboldt County such as farmer's markets, farm gleans and food drives. The total food related diversion in 2014 was 326.11 tons but only the 35.28 tons that are verifiable as having originated from County areas are credited here. HWMA is still participating in California's Carpet Care program to divert carpet and padding from landfills. During CY2014, HWMA accepted 30.08 tons from residential sources, 43.58 tons from commercial sources and an additional 17 tons were diverted by HWMA staff from the transfer station tip floor for an annual total of 90.66 tons of diverted carpet and padding. Since the jurisdiction of origin is not tracked for carpet or padding and all of that diversion work occurred at HWMA's transfer station located within Eureka City limits, all diversion credit went to Eureka even though unincorporated County residents and businesses account for approximately 36% of transfer station customers.

"All County departments shall use recycled products whenever practicable. Special emphasis shall be placed on the purchase of products manufactured with post-consumer recycled materials. All County departments may, at their option and with Purchasing Agent concurrence, require procurement of designated recycled products or recycled products above the levels required by this policy. The County shall require its contractors and consultants to use and specify recycled products in fulfilling contractual obligations whenever practicable. The County shall promote the use of recycled products by publicizing its procurement policy whenever practicable.

The Purchasing Agent will establish a list of recycled products that shall be purchased by all County departments whenever practicable. Specifications of new products and their suggested uses will be made available to all County departments. The Purchasing Team, to the extent financially viable, shall include environmental specifications in bid solicitations, advise departments of more environmentally preferable goods and/or services, identify ways to reduce waste, locate surplus and reuse programs to obtain low cost goods, encourage suppliers to make recyclable products available for purchase, and be mindful of websites and other resources related to environmentally preferable purchasing. The Purchasing Agent is responsible for coordinating all County recycling efforts. "

The policy also includes Section 2.0(f), which allows special districts to utilize County purchasing contracts; Section 13.2.1(c), which grants a 5% credit preference to locally owned businesses and Section 17.3 which allows surplus property donations to public agencies.

Bev Pixley, the County's Senior Buyer, is responsible for this policy and for coordinating the County's recycling efforts. She states that all paper products purchased by the County continue to contain recycled-content paper, including office paper (30%). She also operates an office furniture reuse program for all local government agencies to prevent duplicative purchasing. All furniture from her program is free to other government agencies, local non-profit agencies and schools.

Humboldt County does not have an enforcement program for Mandatory Commercial Recycling. The notice required under the Bill to non-compliant sites is not provided individually. Notice describing MCR applicability and compliance is distributed generally, as described below.
